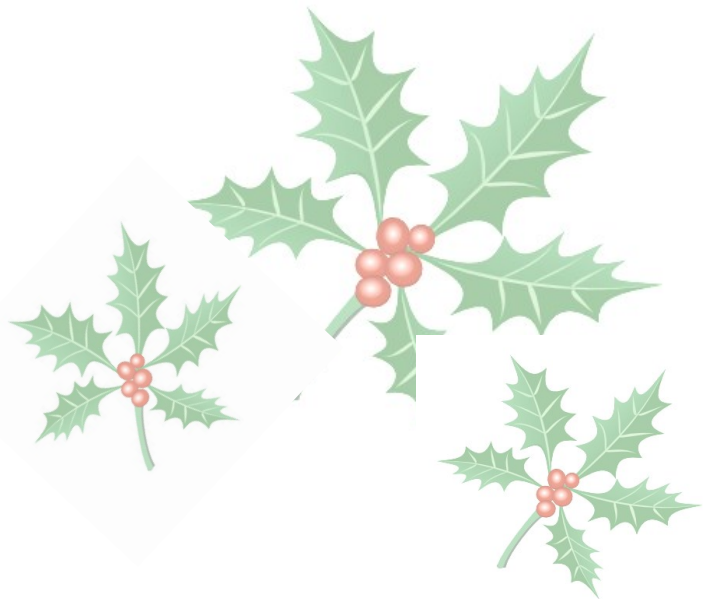

You Can Collect or Contribute Items...
